COVID-19Committee - There has been an uptick in the county in cases. Committee received money for promotion thanking residents on receiving vaccinations. Menards and Lowes are participating in the form of a \$25 gift card. Also, the state of Michigan is promoting <u>www.myshottowin.com</u> to enter to win up to \$50,000 via State of Michigan. Currently, St Clair County is 60% vaccinated.

Fallen Heros – 14 banners have been placed along Lapeer Rd between Baker College and 32nd St. More people have submitted applications for obtaining a banner.

Loves Furniture - Gone out of business. Landmark Realty has listed the building. The building is 75000 sq.ft. with truck wells and storage.

Former Super K Mart – Local realtor has mentioned opportunities for a climate controlled storage type use.

White St Historic Light Move Request – Request has been denied.

653 24th St - Location is requesting a similar zoning like the former Super Kmart.

Smoothie Place – Owner is looking for another location. Current location is doing very well.

Historic lights - Repairs are underway to repair and repaint the lights.

Former Baker College – Community Action agency has taken over and is also subleasing a portion of the building to Community Mental Health. Renting out other portions of the building to others.

Businesses are returning - Restaurants are also returning bit are reporting difficulties in obtaining employees. Some restaurants are opened on a limited hours basis.

Aunt Millies - Has permanently closed citing difficulties in obtaining employees.

Former Mallard Creek Property – under contract to study the feasibility to build housing on the property. Limited time duration to complete otherwise the property returns to the township.

Other Discussion -

Amtrak Depot – No news on the study.
