#### SUPERVISOR'S MESSAGE

I hope everyone enjoyed their Summer. Let's take a moment to talk about Bakers Field Park, a true gem in our community. The pathway extension of almost a mile will start and be completed next year. This path will be paved and wrap around the perimeter of that property. In addition to that project, the tennis and pickleball courts will be resurfaced in the Spring as soon as the weather permits. You may have noticed a new addition to the park this Fall and that is the fitness court, this project was accomplished in partnership with Priority Health. I would urge all residents to check out and utilize this wonderful addition to our community.

The next topic I'd like to cover is streetlights. If you see a streetlight out, please report that outage to the township offices at 810-987-6600, extension 10. When reporting the outage, it helps expedite the process if you take note of the numbers and letters on the light pole located on a yellow tag. DTE Energy also asks that your report include whether the pole is metal or wood. Please keep in mind that DTE addresses repair requests in the order that they are received. The volume of calls determines the length of time before the repair is completed.

A couple of larger projects in the coming year include a new sewer lift station on Maywood and reconstruction of Moak Street between 32nd & 28th Streets. Of course, with roads there will always be additional minor repair and preservation projects. We ask that when you see construction projects, please observe and obey posted speed limits and traffic signs in the township. One of the biggest regular complaints that I receive is the failure of motorists to do this. In addition, we ask that you please ensure that the culvert at the end of your driveway is cleared of debris, lets keep things flowing appropriately.

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#### **CLERK'S CORNER**

By the time you read this we will have wrapped up a very long year of elections. The four elections this year kept our office staff, as well as our dedicated group of Election Inspectors, very busy.

I would like to thank those Election Inspectors that worked this year. Not only were there the four elections, but also three of those required us to staff the 9 days of early voting. Election Inspectors are required to be certified every two years and of course this was the year for that renewal. Our Election Inspectors get paid minimally and this year probably put in 6-8 hours of training in addition to the 15-hour long election days. We are lucky to have a great group of dedicated and caring men and women that believe in the process and work hard to ensure that every vote counts.

We were able to secure a \$10,000 grant from the Institute for Responsive Government to enable us to buy another newer model tabulator. We will also put some of the money toward updating our precinct laptops.

Watch for more information in 2025 with changes to our voting precincts. One of the many changes that Proposal 2 of 2022 brought is the ability to increase the size of our precincts. We will be studying the information from the 2024 elections and determining if we can consolidate some of our precincts. You will be informed if anything changes, by receiving new voter I.D. cards, more newsletter articles, messages on our office sign, Township website, and social media postings.

#### **BUSINESS LICENSES**

Business License renewals will be mailed out very soon. Please be sure to check with us if you do not receive a renewal by mail. Most businesses require a license to operate which includes their fire inspection and cross connection inspection.

#### **FALL IS IN THE AIR!**

Keep in mind that yard waste pick up runs through the end of November. There will be no yard waste pick up after November 29th of 2024 and it will not start again until April 7th of 2025, please plan accordingly.

#### **DPW NEWS**

If you had a new meter installed, you can download the EyeOnWater app for Badger Meters to your phone. This app is a great tool that allows you to track your usage and monitor for leaks and other water related issues. #### FROM THE UTILITIES DESK. . .

We have so many options when it comes to paying your utility bills. We know you're busy and your time is valuable, so we look for ways to make payments easy and convenient to fit your lifestyle.

Online Payments: Pay online at porthurontownship.org, on the main page, in the lower left corner you will see "Pay Bills Online" next to a blue icon that includes a dollar sign. Click that link to make your choice of payment.

Call to Pay: Call 1-855-786-4106 to make a payment

Pay by Text: Get text notifications about your bill and have the option to pay through text message with your default payment method. You can sign up for this service when making an online payment or use the option within your account.

Drop Box Payments: Three drop box options are available to receive payments. The drive-up option is conveniently located in the parking lot entrance. A new lobby drop is now available during office hours as well. After hours, the slot drop box on the glass entrance area is available, along with the drive-up option. All drop box payments should include the payment stub or invoice along with your check.

#### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT**

With winter's arrival on the way, it's time to wrap up those construction projects and get your inspections completed. Also remember if you get a new furnace, air conditioning, or water heater to get a permit and get them inspected. This is a good time to make sure your property is "winter ready". Check your roof, clean out those gutters, mend that fence, and change your furnace filter.

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# SAVE OUR GREAT LAKES FROM MICROPLASTICS!

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

More than half of our waste in the U.S. contains plastic materials. About 10,000 metric tons of plastic enter the Great Lakes every year, and another 8 million goes into the ocean. Over time, larger plastic items break down into much smaller microplastics, such as remnants of water bottles. Soap, toothpaste, paint, and even fibers from clothing generate microplastics. Because of their tiny size, they can easily enter water and food systems.



#### WHAT ARE MICROPLASTICS?

Microplastics are small plastic pieces (fragments, fibers, beads) less than 5mm in size.

#### WHERE DO THEY COME FROM?

**Primary microplastics:** manufactured to be of microscopic size. These can be found in products such as: cosmetics, glitter, paint, coatings, inks, and abrasives.

- oceans
- fresh water lakes, rivers, and groundwater
- drinking water
- food and drinks
- inside of animals, such as fish

### HOW CAN WE REDUCE MIRCROPLASTIC POLLUTION?

- Recycle!
- Clean up: don't leave waste in the environment.
- Wash clothes less frequently

#### **CHIEF PERSIG'S FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS**

Your Port Huron Township Firefighters have been working hard to provide a professional and dedicated response to our residents and guests of Port Huron Charter Township.

Over the past 10 months, our crews have completed daily trainings focusing on honing their specialty rescue skills. These trainings refine our responses to high-risk low-frequency events, such as confined space rescues, high/low angle rescue, Hazardous Material response, and water rescue, to name a few.

On top of that, the duty crews have still maintained training on fire operations and practical medical response! The continued trainings help keep the firefighters' skills sharp in the event they are called to assist in a time of need.

My winter safety tip is use caution with space heaters - Never use a space heater unless you have working smoke alarms - Keep combustibles at least 3 feet away from space heaters - Never use extension cords to power electric space heaters - Make sure your space heater has a tip-over safety switch.

#### **Introducing Our New E-Lockbox for Utility Bill Payments!**

We're excited to offer a faster, more convenient way for residents to pay their utility bills! With our new E-Lockbox, payments made through your bank's Bill Pay system will now be received electronically instead of through the mail.

#### Important Details:

This E-Lockbox is only for utility bills at this time. When setting up your bank bill pay to make a utility payment, be sure to use your entire 12-digit account number, similar to:


ACCT.NO including all zeros, to ensure it's processed correctly. Processing time is usually 1-2 business days.

PNote: Utility Bills and Tax Bills Have Different Account Numbers:

#### ✓ For Tax Payments:

- Bank Bill Pay Tax payments will still be sent by mail and processed as we receive them. Our experience with the mail this summer is that it may take 7 to 21 days or longer for us to receive them. We will be moving this to an E-Lockbox like the utility bills sometime in late 2025.
- Be sure to enter the **entire 14-digit parcel number** similar like this below (starting with 74-28) in the account number section when setting up your tax bill payments through Bill Pay. Using dashes (-) are acceptable. Summer and Winter Tax bills will use the same parcel number. Summer Tax for Prop #: 74-28-864-0007-000
- If your payment arrives by the due date, it will be posted on time. However, payments received after the due date will be considered late and subject to late fees and penalties. We do not accept a postmark for payment.
- Do not use your utility bill account number when paying taxes, the payment will be credited to your utility bill and cannot be returned or moved. You will still owe the full amount on your tax bill.

#### WHY DOES MY DRINKING WATER LOOK CLOUDY?

There are two very common, non-harmful causes of cloudy water. In most cases, real fine air bubbles or very fine particles of matter, such as dirt or organic matter get mixed in your drinking water.

Air bubbles can form naturally in well water or can be created during pumping of municipal water. Cloudy water (white water) can be created by real fine air bubbles in the water.

It usually happens when it is very cold outside because the solubility of air in water increases as water pressure increases and/or water temperature decreases. Cold water holds more air than warm water. In the winter, water travels from the reservoir which is very cold and warms up during its travel to your tap. Some of the air that is present is no longer soluble, and comes out of solution.

Also, water pressure has something to do with it. The water in the pipes is pressurized to a degree (which helps to get the water all the way from the water tower to your home). Water under pressure holds more air than water that is not pressurized. Once the water comes out of your tap, the water is no longer under pressure and the air comes out of solution as bubbles (similar to a carbonated soft drink). It is completely harmless.

The best thing to do is let it sit in an open container until the bubbles naturally disappear.

Tiny particles from rocks and stone in earth, as well as sand and dirt can get suspended in your water supply. Again, these are generally harmless and more aesthetically displeasing. You may also see grit in the bottom of your sinks and tubs if particles are present.

You can usually differentiate particle from air bubbles by filling a clear glass and letting it sit for a few minutes. If the cloudiness is due to air, the bubbles will rise to the surface and disappear; if the water does not clear, it generally indicates particles are in the source of water.

Generally, treating with a sediment filter will remove the particles.

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#### ASSESSMENT CHANGE NOTICES

Property owners will soon be receiving the annual Notice of Assessment, Taxable Valuation, and Property Classification, otherwise known as the "Assessment Change Notice".

The Notice indicates what the Assessor is proposing the value of your property to be for the upcoming taxing year. By law, values are based on the condition of the property on December 31st of the previous year – i.e., the 2025 value is based on the condition of your property on December 31, 2024.

If you disagree with the proposed value of your property, you must appeal to the Board of Review, which consists of 3 Township residents. The Board of Review hears appeals by either appointment or letter. The meeting dates and times are listed on the Change Notice. You can schedule an appointment by contacting the Assessor's Office. If you must appeal by letter, it must be received in the office by the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the final meeting date.

When you arrive for your appointment, you will be given a petition form to complete. Most successful appellants present documentation to support their claim that the property is over-assessed. The highest and best documentation to provide is an independent appraisal, however, this is not mandatory. Board of Review appointments are scheduled for 10 minutes for each property being appealed.

The Notices are mailed annually at the end of February. If your mailing address has changed, please contact the Assessor's Office at 810-987-6600, ext 20 or email psimpson@porthurontownship.org to confirm that we have the correct address in our records.

#### CODE ENFORCEMENT

With the onset of winter, please be aware that Township ordinances require recreational vehicles to be stored in the rear yard. The term recreational vehicle includes boats, recreational trailers, motorhomes, snowmobiles (and the trailers). Storage of this equipment in the front yard constitutes an ordinance violation.
